Dear Valued Customers,

The U.S. Conflict Minerals Law (Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act) became effective on July 21, 2010. The law defines conflict minerals as certain minerals originating from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries. Regulations have been implemented regarding the law and companies are required to report the use of any conflict minerals originating from the DRC or adjoining countries.

The minerals that are subject to the law include: cassiterite, columbite-tantalite, gold, tantalum, tin, tungsten, and wolframite.

Westfield Steel, Inc. does not engage in the actual melting or manufacture of the raw material used in any of our end products. We have requested and received letters from our material suppliers stating compliance with this law. These letters can be made available for your review upon request.

Based upon our review of the letters from our suppliers, Westfield Steel, Inc. is not aware of the use of any Conflict Minerals sources from listed DRC countries in our products. We will continue to proactively work with our suppliers to verify a conflict free supply chain.
